

The stripes upon our stately flag Were touched by His sweet grace Each star of white that shines so bright Reflects His loving face.


So as you turn to face the flag For battles that were fought Be filled with pride for those who died And freedoms that were bought.


But don't forget to thank the One That gives the bright display The reason why we paint the sky On Independence Day

Patriotic Trivia

As we celebrate America's birthday, it's interesting to note that clergymen wrote both the Pledge of Allegiance and the hymn, 'My Country Tis of Thee.' Rev. Francis Bellamy wrote the pledge in 1892. Rev. Samuel Francis Smith wrote the hymn in 1831. Both men were Baptist ministers.

The pledge was first used in public school in 1892 during Columbus Day observances. 'My Country Tis of Thee' was used as a national song before 'The Star Spangled Banner' was named America's national anthem in 1931.
